(Intended) Nationally Determined Contributions (INDCs, NDCs). is a term used under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) for voluntary reductions in greenhouse gas emissions that all countries that signed the UNFCCC were asked to publish in the lead-up to the 2015 United Nations Climate Change Conference held in Paris, France, in December 2015.) The word 'Intended' could be deleted after ratification of the Paris Agreement.
